WE KNOW THAT the Ontario youth sector is committed to making a positive difference in the lives of young people, providing them with the skills and resources they need to make positive contributions to their communities.

WE RECOGNIZE THAT that youth programs sometimes struggle to understand how to measure these processes and outcomes and articulate the impact of their programs to their stakeholders – including parents, funders, and youth themselves.

IN THIS COURSE, participants will learn how to develop an evaluation plan, implement this plan and use the findings to improve their programs and share their impact.

KEY CERTIFICATE FEATURES

- ✓ Participants will receive a comprehensive certificate outline that includes lesson plans and resources for all lessons and assignments on September 13, 2017.
- ✓ All 10 lessons will be available to participants on September 15, 2017 when the certificate begins so participants can learn at their own pace. They will be able to stay on track with the help of suggested timelines that guide them through the required work.
- ✓ There will be a live welcome and orientation webinar on September 14, 2017 where participants can ask questions in real time and engage with the YouthREX Teaching Team. The welcome webinar will include a walk through of the certificate structure and the learning platform.
- ✓ Participants will also have access to YouthREX's evaluation webinars that are specially developed to support the evaluation capacity of youth sector programs in Ontario.



Participants will receive a Certificate of Completion from YouthREX, York University if they complete all 4 modules and a minimum of 4 assignments.

Those who complete individual modules and not the full certificate (all 4 modules) will receive a Certificate of Participation for the completed modules from YouthREX, York University.



WHY TAKE THIS COURSE?

Through involvement in this course, participants will:

- ✓ Understand common program evaluation concepts and ideas, and appropriate uses of different types of evaluation
- ✓ Learn the processes and activities involved in program evaluation through hands-on assignments that can help inform your own youth program
- ✓ Understand the process of engaging youth in evaluation
- ✓ Become familiar with qualitative and quantitative research methods used in conducting evaluations
- ✓ Learn how to use evaluation findings to improve programs and services



WHO IS THIS CERTIFICATE FOR?

Frontline youth workers, management staff, students, researchers, and other professionals who are new to evaluation will find this certificate useful. The certificate is particularly useful for participants from youth sector organizations who are currently involved in or are considering embarking on a program evaluation journey. It does not require any previous understanding of evaluation or research methods.



STRUCTURE OF THE COURSE

- ✓ The certificate includes 4 modules comprised of a total of 10 lessons. Each weekly lesson requires up to 3 hours of work and includes course-specific recorded learning videos and other resources.
- ✓ There are suggested timelines and due dates for the lessons and assignments to help you progress through the 10-week course.
- ✓ The certificate includes a live welcome and orientation webinar on September 14, 2017 where participants can ask questions in real time and engage with the YouthREX Teaching Team.
- ✓ There are 6 small assignments that help you work through the development of an evaluation plan for your program.
- ✓ Participants will also have access to YouthREX's evaluation webinars that are specially developed to support the evaluation capacity of youth sector programs in Ontario.
- ✓ There is a discussion board for participants to post, share and engage with their peers and the YouthREX Teaching Team.
