Qualitative Tools



World Café



This tool can be used when hosting large groups to foster conversation, story sharing, problem solving, and planning. It is an easy-to-use method for creating a living network of collaborative dialogue around questions that matter in service to real work.

How does it work?

Seven World Café design principles

- 1. Set the context
 - Pay attention to purpose and parameters of meeting
- 2. Create hospitable space
 - Invitation, physical set-up
- 3. Explore questions that matter
 - Find questions that are relevant to real-life concerns of group
- 4. Encourage everyone's contribution
 - Encourage ideas, perspectives and listening

- 5. Connect diverse perspectives
 - Move between tables, link different thoughts
- Listen together for patterns and insights
 - Pay attention to themes
- 7. Share collective discoveries
 - Reflection on patterns and share with group

Instructions

- Seat 4 or 5 people at cluster tables.
- Set up 3 rounds of conversations of 20-30 minutes each.
- Engage groups in questions.
- Encourage groups to write and draw key ideas on their tablecloths.

- Upon completing the initial round of conversation, ask 1 person to remain at the table as the host while the others serve as travelers.
- Ask the table host to welcome the new guests and briefly share the main ideas of the initial conversation. Encourage guests to connect ideas coming from their previous table conversations.
- At the end of the second round, all of the tables or conversation clusters in the room will be crosspollinated with insights from prior conversations.

- In the third round of conversation, people can return to their home (original) tables to synthesize their discoveries, or they may continue traveling to new tables, leaving the same or a new host at the table. Sometimes a new question that helps
- deepen the exploration is posed for the third round of conversation.
- After several rounds of conversation, initiate a period of sharing discoveries and insights in a whole group conversation.
