

Both YouthREX and York University recognize that many Indigenous Nations have longstanding relationships with the territories upon which York University campuses are located that precede the establishment of York University. The area known as Tkaronto has been care taken by the Anishinabek Nation, the Haudenosaunee Confederacy, and the Huron-Wendat. It is now home to many First Nation, Inuit, and Métis communities. This territory is subject of the Dish with One Spoon Wampum: Belt Covenant, an agreement to peaceably share and care for the Great Lakes region.

Leading in Colour is a youth-led community organization exclusively by and for racialized youth under the age of 30.


Their goal is to train young leaders in activism-based skills that they can use to advocate for themselves and their communities, through peer-to-peer knowledge sharing.
