The Rippling Impacts of Cannabis Criminalization - Individual Impacts

- Cannabis charges as a gateway into the carceral system
- **Escalatory charges** stemming from impacts initiated due to cannabis (resisting arrest, assaulting a police office, unrelated "offences")
- Incalculable harm and loss of incarceration
- **Difficulty accessing financial resources** upon release
- Long-term harm of **criminal record**, producing social and economic marginalization
- Restricted life-course outcomes

The Rippling Impacts of Cannabis Criminalization - Community Impacts

- **Targeted, racist policing** disproportionately concentrating arrests, incarceration, and criminal records in specific communities and areas.
- Restricted economic opportunities as experienced by an individual compound when experienced by large segments of a community. Reduces economic opportunities for the entire community.
- Reduction in public and private investment and activity, designation as a 'problem' or 'high-crime' area or population.
- Designation used to justify increasing targeted policing, arrests, and incarceration.
- **Cycle repeats and entrenches over time**, producing racist structural inequity, racist stereotypes, racist politics, etc.
