Overview of the Youth Advisory Committee at Good Neighbors Canada

The Youth Advisory Committee (YAC), also known as GNCA-YAC, is a volunteer-based leadership program for Canadian youth **aged 18 to 30**. Our aim is to foster essential leadership, governance, and community engagement skills crucial for success in the nonprofit sustainable development sector, all while supporting the mission of Good Neighbors Canada (GNCA).

We're seeking approximately **11 enthusiastic Members** for our 2023/2024 virtual program. Onboarding will kick off in September 2023, with Members dedicating around **5 hours per week** until the program concludes in April 2024.

YAC Members will work together to ensure the program's success. This involves **hosting virtual events, workshops, and initiatives** to promote, fundraise for, and raise awareness about GNCA's projects and campaigns. The YAC will also bridge local and global issues to engage the public effectively.

The YAC will virtually meet a *minimum* of **once per month** (more virtual meetings will likely be necessary closer to event dates). YAC Members are required to maintain regular communication among themselves and their respective sub-committees, fostering a culture of collaboration and transparency. Members will adhere to a *Constitution* and *Code of Ethics* that they will sign before starting the program.

Over the course of the program, the YAC will organize a *minimum* of **8 virtual public events**, all designed to support GNCA's mission.

As a Member, you have access to:

- Training:
 - Exclusive monthly virtual workshops on topics including volunteer management, good governance and effective fundraising strategies led by Good Neighbors Canada
- Personal & Professional Development:
 - Including a Virtual Coffee Chat Program with experienced Good Neighbors Canada professionals
 - Possibility to participate in in-person events hosted in collaboration with Good Neighbors Canada where opportunities arise
- Experiential learning projects supporting Good Neighbors Canada:
 - Good Neighbors Canada will assign a project for the YAC to complete within a four week cycle



Upon completion of the YAC program in April 2024, members will receive or have access to the following:

- E-certificate & LinkedIn badge to acknowledge successful completion of the program and the skills they have gained through the program
- Opportunity to be selected for a **\$1,000 scholarship** towards their professional development *or* a **voluntary overseas placement** at a partner Good Neighbors office
 - The selection will be conducted by Good Neighbors Canada's management team
 - Only 1 YAC member per cohort will be awarded the scholarship *or* voluntary overseas placement
- Opportunity to be selected for the Good Neighbors Canada: Youth Leader Award
- Letter of Recommendation from Good Neighbors Canada's management team
- **Opportunities for hiring** for YAC members, who meet GNCA's skillset & requirements, to interview for *paid* positions
- Network and Alumni access via a private Whatsapp Community

About Good Neighbors Canada

Good Neighbors Canada (GNCA) is a charitable nonprofit and national affiliate of Good Neighbors International, specializing in community projects to achieve sustainable development around the world.

Our ongoing programs include the <u>Wishing Well Project</u>, providing clean drinking water for rural communities in Zambia, the <u>Better Life for Girls</u> campaign, advancing gender equity in Africa and Latin America, poverty alleviation in Cameroon and the Dominican Republic through <u>child</u> <u>sponsorship</u>, emergency relief in response to humanitarian crises including the <u>Ukraine war</u> and the <u>Turkish/Syrian earthquake</u>, and the <u>Goods4Causes</u> initiative, supporting income generation for marginalized groups here in Canada and worldwide.

Selection Criteria

- You are between the ages of 18 30 at the start of the term date. If you don't fit this criteria but feel strongly about joining the program, please send an email to <u>vac@gncanada.ca</u> to discuss eligibility with the team.
- You can be living *anywhere in Canada* for the duration of September 2023 to April 2024 inclusive
- You can be studying, working, or pursuing any initiatives there is *no education* (university or college) requirement needed to apply
- Professional proficiency in English, French optional.

Requirements

• Expected to *commit* to the all aspect of the program throughout its duration, including but not limited to: attending meetings, organizing events and workshops, and raising awareness for GNCA



- A weekly commitment of 5 hours
- High level of initiative, organization, self-motivation, collaboration & problem-solving skills
- Strong intercultural competency, awareness, and appreciation for people with diverse backgrounds and experiences
- Strong self-awareness, empathy, and emotional intelligence
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Professional proficiency in English. French language proficiency is an *asset*
- Experience working with Canadian nonprofits or in the social impact sector is an *asset*

Applications are judged based on the following criteria:

- Demonstrated interest in community development, nonprofit work, and contributing to Good Neighbors Canada's mission
- Demonstrated interest in building their own leadership and community engagement skills with a strong passion for driving positive change in their communities and globally
- Diversity in terms of candidates who identify as members of Indigenous, Black, racialized, 2SLGBTQ+ communities, persons with disabilities, and other equity deserving groups are encouraged to apply, and their lived experience shall be taken into consideration

As a small charity subject to separate restricted funding agreements, Good Neighbors Canada may provide funding towards GNCA YAC initiatives where it is deemed that the YAC's activities will directly benefit the charity's programs. The YAC will be able to submit funding requests to GNCA for review and, upon approval, GNCA will coordinate directly with the relevant Members to coordinate spending and post-event reporting of return on investment.
