Exercise 1

THINKING ABOUT YOUR LOGIC MODEL

Please take a few moments to sit down with your team and answer the following questions based on the organization or part of your program that you wish to create a logic model for. These are the first steps in the logic model process.

1. What is the vision for your organization or program?

2. What goals do you wish to achieve through this vision?

TARGET POPULATION	RESOURCES	SERVICES
Which youth are identified within the community as participants in your programs? What are their needs?	What assets and supplies are needed to accomplish this activity?	What activities or programming must we provide to address the identified needs of the youth that is our target group?

3. ASSUMPTIONS

Create your assumption statement. Based on the work done on pages 1 and 2, create a statement that outlines why you believe your approach will have positive results with the youth you serve. Be sure to cite the references you use to support your assertions.



Note: As you progress through the subsequent modules and exercises, you will want to “loop back” and revisit this section, revising and rethinking your assumptions.

- 2 Long-term Outcomes
- 3 Intermediate Outcomes for at least one of the long-term outcomes identified
- 3 Short-term Outcomes for at least one of the intermediate outcomes identified

- Who
- Will Do
- What

These outcomes should relate directly back to your target population, resources, and services identified in Exercise 1.
